A Year in Review

First Knowledge Exchange

Knowledge Exchanges are an opportunity to bring perinatal mental health foundational knowledge to organizations who work with perinatal communities. These are offered for free to organizations. Together Waterloo's first knowledge exchange was with Canadian Arab Women's Association.

Politician Connections

In March 2023, Minister Carolyn Bennett reached out to Together Waterloo inviting us to a roundtable discussion about perinatal mental health in Canada. On April 14th, 2023 Together board members, stakeholder partners, and other politicians met. Subsequent meetings were scheduled with MP Mike Morrice and former MPP Laura Mae Lindo.



Climb Fundraiser

Together Waterloo's third annual Climb Out of the Darkness fundraiser took place on June 24th, 2023. The Climb offered activities and opportunities for connection to the community. MP Mike Morrice and Kitchener Mayor Barry Vrbanovic were in attendance and spoke at the event.

Support Groups

2SLGBTQIA+ Therapeutic Support group welcomed parents in Ontario to come together to share and process fertility, pregnancy, birth and postpartum issues with the guidance of a registered social worker. Two successful sessions of the group were held in the Winter and Fall of 2023. Funds from CPMHC's Flora's Walk made the fall group possible.

Community Engagement

Together Waterloo became members of the CivicHub in July 2023. This membership provides opportunities to network with other Waterloo Region grassroot organizations.

Community organizations invited Together Waterloo to attend and participate in events. These events allowed Together Waterloo to raise awareness around poverty and parenting, perinatal suicide prevention, and resources.

EarlyON Contract

In April 2023, EarlyON Waterloo Region requested a perinatal mental health foundational training proposal for their employees. Upon receiving funding from the Ministry of Education, Together Waterloo received a contract for four trainings.




